


Summer Safety


10 tips towards a safer summer




Playing near water is dangerous. If a friend, pet or toy falls into water - NEVER go in after them. Get HELP from an adult as quickly as you can.

In an emergency call - 999.

Never use candles, gas appliances or flammable liquids in or near tents - they can easily catch fire.



Always make sure there is a clear escape route. Fire spreads quickly outdoors call - 999.



Play in a safe place, away from fire or barbecues.




All fires must be supervised by an adult.

Never leave a fire unattended.



When refuelling, remind everyone to keep their windows shut, to prevent flammable gases from entering the car.




Set your barbecue up on a flat ground, well away from sheds fences and trees.

Also keep a bucket of water or sand close by.




Don't overload plug sockets at home or on holiday.

They can overheat and catch fire.



Even in a caravan, you must have a working smoke alarm fitted on to the ceiling.

Check it regularly.



Never ever play with lighters or matches.

Grown-ups should put them away where children can't find them.
